

# **EDUCATION**

# **College Program**

Greenwood Project's College programs provide rigorous training and work experiences for students across multiple years of their College careers. After a fourweek intensive boot camp covering professional skills, accounting principles, and the basics of financial markets and valuation, students move into six-week internships at partner companies across the Financial Services industry. Upon completion of their summer training, students pursue traditional ten to twelve-week internship placements. Throughout their engagement with the Greenwood Project, students meet and interact with over 170 corporate volunteers and professionals.



# High School Summer Financial Institute

Chicagoland High School Students are immersed in an intensive six-week program that combines financial and technical education with extensive exposure to careers in the Financial Services industry. Students meet and interact with corporate volunteers and learn firsthand about their companies, their roles, and various career pathways into the industry.

# High School Summer FinTech Institute

FinTech is transforming the Financial Sector. At the FinTech Institute, high school students learn professional skills, get an introduction to coding, and practice basic functions of the programming language Python.

Students complete mini projects where they apply their coding skills to complete basic financial analysis. The program culminates in a final presentation where students write code to analyze market data and create an investing strategy based on their analysis.
